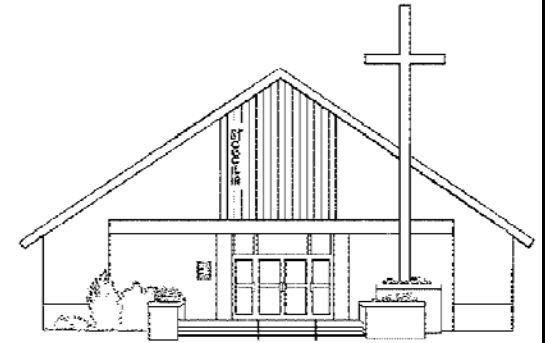

The first miraculous "sign" of Jesus recounted in the fourth Gospel occurs at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Not only does his presence bless the covenant of marriage; he personally heightens the celebration. Prompted by His mother, who informs him that there is no more wine and who alerts the attendants to do "whatever he tells you," Jesus transforms six stone jars of water into wine.
