Did you know that... Paul Acoose [1885-1978] from Zagime [Sakimay] Anishinabek First Nation, Saskatchewan was a world class distance runner. In 1909 he turned professional and went on to win many races. He travelled to New York where he finished second in a 20-mile race in Madison Square Gardens. On March 30, 1910, Paul defeated Tom Longboat [winner of the 1907 Boston Marathon] in a 12-mile race in Toronto. He was inducted into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame in 1983.


