This morning at 10:30 am (Mountain Time), the first block of public tickets (free) will be released for Mass at Commonwealth Stadium (July 26). NB: The first block of free tickets for Pope Francis' open air Mass released on July 6 sold out within minutes. These blocks of tickets are being made available to the general public. Residential School Survivors attending as groups with First Nations, Inuit, and Metis communities or with diocesan groups will have access to much larger blocks of tickets through those organizing groups.

A second block of tickets for the general public will be offered on Monday, July 11 at 10:30 am, and a final block on Monday, July 18 at 10:30 am. The Mass will be held on Tuesday, July 26, 10:15 am at Commonwealth Stadium in Edmonton. [Direct link to tickets](#).

After 4 years of service as the Bishop's delegate on Clergy Sexual Abuse, Fr. Bradford Fahlman is moving on to work in other areas in the Archdiocese. We are deeply grateful for his time and commitment as delegate. Archbishop Bolen has appointed Maureen Dumonceaux to succeed Fr. Brad. Archbishop Bolen has also appointed Deacon David Hudy as deputy delegate. Both appointments will start on August 1st, 2022.

Both the confidential email enquiry@archregina.sk.ca and the confidential phone number 1-306-400-3655 will continue to be utilized. It will be continued practice that if the delegate is not available, the deputy delegate will be the contact person. At this time there are no policy changes.
