Walking Together: Survivors to Edmonton

The July 17 bulletin included an important message from the Archdiocese explaining funding of the trip and accepting donations to cover the cost for Indigenous survivors and support persons who travelled to Alberta and the hosting of a livestream event in Regina.

The initiative is projected to cost nearly \$100,000. So far, \$45,000 has been raised and the Archdiocese extends their gratitude.
