

This week, help your children learn more about Jesus so that they can be joyous witnesses of God's love.



Read to the children from the New Testament. Tell them about the parables and how Jesus loved to teach through stories. Read to them about the marvelous miracles: curing the blind and deaf, walking on water, multiplying the loaves and fish.

Talk to the children about becoming witnesses to the wonderful news of God's love. Remind them how lucky they are to know Jesus. Explain to them how they can become "witnesses" to God's love by sharing God's words with others.


Have each child make a button. You can use a plastic can

cover or a jar lid. Cover the lid with paper and decorate it with smile faces, flowers, or whatever makes the child feel happy. Add the words, ASK ME ABOUT JESUS. Tape a small safety pin to the back.

When the children wear their buttons, they might be surprised at how many people will ask them about Jesus. They can share the stories you had read together earlier in the week.

There is a chain reaction to this week's project. As parents, you will be witnessing to your children so that they may go out and witness to others.




## Jesus Teaches in His Hometown
